CVT Training: 15-18 month intensive CVT training program at one of six approved sites (Harry T. Harper, Jr. School of Cardiac and Vascular Technology, Piedmont Augusta (Augusta, GA), Claude W. Smith, M.D. School of Cardiovascular Technology at Medical University Hospital Authority (Columbia, SC), Prisma Health, Health Sciences Center (Greenville, SC), Hoffman Heart and Vascular Institute, St. Francis Hospital and Medical Center (Hartford, CT), Piedmont Technical College (Greenwood, SC), Cardiac and Vascular Institute of Ultrasound (Mobile, AL))⁹ (28 Credit Hours)

- 1. Regardless of individual course grades, students must have a minimum 2.50 GPA upon completion of 30 credit hours and a minimum 2.75 GPA upon completion of 60 hours.
- 2. Some colleges require a minimum GPA for major courses. Courses indicated in this column are included in the major GPA for this program of study.
- 3. Students who do not place into MATH 122 or 141 will be required to successfully complete the required prerequisite before taking either MATH 122 or 141.
- Students in the College of Arts and Sciences are required to demonstrate proficiency in one foreign language equivalent to the 122 course through
 course credit or the corresponding foreign language placement score.
- 5. The Carolina Core provides the common core of knowledge, skill and academic experience for all Carolina undergraduate students.
- 6. Biology or Chemistry Elective (6 hours): Select from BIOL/CHEM 300-699.
- 7. The College of Arts and Sciences requires one U.S. History and one non-U.S. History course, both of which must be chosen from the approved Carolina Core GHS courses. Whichever is not fulfilled through the Carolina Core GHS requirement must be fulfilled through this college requirement.
- 8. No courses of a remedial, developmental, skill-acquiring, or vocational nature may apply as credit toward degrees in the College of Arts and Sciences. The College of Arts and Sciences allows the use of the Pass-Fail option on elective courses. Further clarification on inapplicable courses can be obtained from the College of Arts and Sciences.
- 9. Upon completion of the specified academic requirements, only students who have gained admission into an approved CVT training facility will be retained in the major. Following the academic portion of the Cardiovascular Technology Program, a 15-18 months clinical training program in an approved facility will be the final stage of the degree program. Students will be awarded 28 credit hours upon completion of the clinical portion of the training.

Program Notes:

- ENGL 101 and ENGL 102 must be completed in the student's first 60 semester hours of work in order for these courses to be credited toward graduation. Other courses identified as "critical" may affect time to graduation due to prerequisite requirements for subsequent required courses.
- All undergraduate students must take a 3-credit course or its equivalent with a passing grade that covers the founding documents. This course may fulfill any requirement in the program of study. Courses that meet this requirement are listed in the academic <u>bulletin</u>.
- Students who have already completed a CVT training program or CVT internship will not be eligible for acceptance into this major.
- The last 30 credit hours toward your degree must be earned in residence at the University of South Carolina-Columbia.
